### **The following are large group activities of service available on site at East.**

- **Justice-Walking Program** J-Walking is a small-group conversion process that initiates older high school teens and adult coordinators into life giving relationships, transformed by the Gospel and the application of Catholic Social Teachings. It is a prayerful, three month process bringing adults and high school juniors and seniors into a small Christian community in order to practice Gospel-based living. The gatherings will take place both at school (after-school or evening depending on the needs of those involved) and the service site (selected by the group)
- **The Kingdom Project** (Parable of the Talents)  
Matthew 25:14-30/Luke 19:11-27  
Applying what they have learned by participating in the service learning program, **interested and approved** seniors may **apply** for the Kingdom Project. Each student/team is given \$100.00 (seed money) to be used to benefit others in a tangible way. They design a project with permission from a supervisor that allows the seed money to increase to do the most good for their project and the benefiting group. The project must include the school community.
- **Hunger Banquet** Funds raised will benefit area soup kitchens. This project will involve meetings (after school) to learn about hunger both locally and globally and planning responsibilities for the banquet (evening meal). A written reflection paper is required to allow the student/team an opportunity to reflect on their experiences.
