

Full-Time Director of Campus Ministry/Religion Teacher

Job Description.

The Director of Campus Ministry is responsible for overseeing East Catholic's spiritual formation and service-learning programs in a way that faithfully implements the school's Mission and Strategic Plan. The Director of Campus Ministry is charged with enhancing the spiritual development of the entire school community: students and families, faculty and staff, and administration. To achieve this, the Director collaborates with the faculty and staff, especially of the Religion Department, and works as part of a team with other Campus Ministers. The Director reports to the Dean of Student Life, with frequent consultation with the President. The Director may also teach up to three classes, depending on the school's academic needs.

ECHS Mission

East Catholic High School is a regional college-preparatory school of the <u>Archdiocese of Hartford</u>. Building on Catholic tradition and the charism of the <u>Sisters of Notre Dame de Namur</u>, we challenge our students to build strong moral character while pursuing academic excellence, responsible citizenship, active participation in community service, sportsmanship, and an appreciation for the fine arts. Guided by the teachings of Jesus Christ, East Catholic is a welcoming environment for all students.

History

Founded in 1961 by the <u>Archdiocese of Hartford</u>, East Catholic High School is a coeducational college preparatory high school that provides a values-based education within an authentically Catholic yet ecumenically sensitive community. Since its earliest days, the school has been associated with the <u>Sisters of Notre Dame de Namur</u>, whose charism of education and service enriches all aspects of the East Catholic experience. Located in Manchester, Connecticut, East Catholic serves Catholic and non-Catholic students from more than 35 communities in the Greater Hartford and Northeast regions of the state. East has been recognized as a "<u>Blue Ribbon School of Excellence</u>" by the U.S. Department of Education. East Catholic High School is accredited by the <u>New England Association of Schools and Colleges (NEASC)</u>.

Specific responsibilities regarding the spiritual formation program include:

- Ensures, along with the Administration, that the mission of East Catholic High School, the charism of the Sisters of Notre Dame de Namur, and the Catholic identity of the school are clearly articulated and carried out to all constituents.
- Provides and oversees retreat opportunities for all students.
- Directs the work of the student Peer Ministry team.
- Oversees all liturgies (including the Baccalaureate Mass) and prayer services, in consultation with the school Chaplain.
- Coordinates opportunities for communal prayer and faith sharing: Agape Latte, Morning Prayer, Third Period Prayer, faculty/staff meetings, and in-service faith formation.
- Collaborates with the Administration in planning and implementing faculty/staff retreats.

Duties and Responsibilities:

Duties pertaining to the service-learning program include:

- Oversees and monitors the school-wide STRETCH service-learning program.
 - Uses MobileServe app/website to share service opportunities and monitor student progress toward service hour targets, including approval of service logs.
 - o Updates the Religion Department regarding student progress at least quarterly.
- Coordinates and participates directly in East Catholic's community service opportunities (alongside students), including:
 - o Cooking and serving meals for local homeless shelters twice per month.
 - o Annual service immersion trip to West Virginia in February.
 - o Annual City of Manchester day of service in April.
 - Other evening and weekend programs as arranged with local organizations.
- Directs the work of the student STRETCH Leaders.
- In collaboration with the Religion Department, oversees the continued revision of the STRETCH Program to ensure relevance and impact on East Catholic students.

Other duties include:

- Serves on the Senior Leadership Team and Academic Council, and attends all meetings.
- Serves as a member of the Religion Department, and teaches up to three classes per year.
- Oversees all aspects of the Campus Ministry budget, and assumes fiscal responsibility.
- Attends and supports all school assemblies, faculty/staff meetings, designated in-services and weekend and evening events as requested.
