Honored with the Light of Christ Award by the Archdiocese of Hartford in 2021, Ms. Burby continues to oversee digital book orders and coach Cheerleading, which "lets me keep the contact with parents and students that I love," she explained. She is thankful to join up with Dean of Student Life Jan Reilly and President Sean Brennan; "We complement each other very well," she said, "and I'm proud to be part of this strong administration." She also has a clear vision for the school's future "as we keep growing."

East Catholic students continue to give back to the community by doing service at ImmaCare, a shelter in Hartford for people experiencing

homelessness. High density fishing line, also called monofilament line, can hurt wildlife and negatively impact the environment if not disposed of properly. By providing easy-to-use recycling bins where people fish, the East Windsor Parks & Recreation can properly dispose of fishing line. Matthew is currently studying at the University of Connecticut.




Planned ECHS Integrated Technology Center

In a world of ever-changing technology, our new center will allow students to develop new skills that will carry them into the future to become responsible, independent, and creative users of information and technology. Through our diverse collection of resources, students will utilize project-based instruction, work-based learning, and personalized support to promote personal enrichment and academic success.



The TV & Media broadcasting room will prepare students for careers in news writing, television, radio, film production, filmmaking, graphic design and illustration, photography, and communication. The center will be equipped with modern camera equipment, a control room, and much more.



Our Robotics team (Aetos Dios FRC Team 7153) will be using the center to design and engineer robots for their build and competition seasons and for demo robots for the community.



The Computer-Aided Design (CAD) lab will be equipped with new computers which will allow our future engineers to become familiar with sketching, lettering, scale drawing, print reading, visualization, dimensioning, and problemsolving techniques used by engineers and designers around the world. State-ofthe-art 3-D and laser printers will also be housed in the lab.

This year's Convocation brought the return of East Catholic traditions, as well as new opportunities to teach and honor together the legacy of September 11, 2001. To ground the school community in this year's theme of selflessness, bring back a school-wide summer reading experience, and deepen understanding of 9/11/01 for students who were not even born on that day, President Sean Brennan and English department chair Lisa Kirsche selected The Red Bandanna by Tom Rinaldi as this year's One Book One Community text. On September 10th, the East Catholic community gathered to explore its lessons and set the tone for the school year.

The Red Bandanna tells the story of Welles Crowther, the 24 year-old equities trader and trained firefighter who worked on the 104th floor of the South Tower in 2001. He changed the course of many lives, including his own, when he led shocked and wounded colleagues down 17 flights of stairs, only to turn and announce, "I'm going back up." Perhaps the details of Welles' final hour would remain lost if not for the red bandana he wore, which survivors remembered along with his steady command to "Follow me." Ultimately, over a dozen survivors pieced together that because of Welles' actions, they lived; his recovered remains showed he was conferring with first responders when the South Tower collapsed.

While Welles Crowther's story is hardly the only 9/11/01 story of loss and heroism, as


Mr. Brennan explained, it exemplifies "how to be giving of mind, body and soul to others through service and kindness," making it an ideal focus for Convocation. The day began with brief advisory meetings before the entire school gathered for Mass. Next, everyone watched a short ESPN video, "The Man in the Red Bandana" and listened to Mr. Brennan's opening reflections. Following Mr. Brennan, Fine Arts department chair David Brudz shared his own 9/11/01 story, recalling his view of the towers from his own classroom in New York, and his drive to keep his composure as his young students sat facing him, unaware of such devastation nearby. Once Mr. Brudz finished, students met again in small groups; Peer Ministers and

advisors launched discussions and led activities on how to foster selflessness in school, at home and in society. After this, the community reconvened in the auditorium to share new insights, and Peer Ministers officially introduced themselves to the

student body and clarified their role within the school.

To close, Director of Campus Ministry Patrick McLaughlin offered a final prayer, inviting us to reflect on one particular Bible verse that resonated throughout the day: "No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends" John 15:13 (NRSV). At different points in the day, both Mr. McLaughlin and Mr. Brennan emphasized how selflessness does not have to be taken to literal extremes. Rather, Welles Crowther and so many others on 9/11/01 can inspire us to do our own acts of giving for the sake of others, helping all of us rise.





Stage East Returns

Just as Broadway gleefully reopened its doors this fall, Stage East celebrated its return to the stage with its first official performances since March of 2020. Director Jillian Quackenbush and Assistant Director Noah Leonard guided the Stage East Players as they brought together Ms. Quackenbush's vision of "A Tale of Two One-Acts." On October 22nd and 23rd, they performed "That's Not How I Remember It" by Don Zolidis and "The Rules of Comedy" by Peter Bloedel. The director chose each play to foster a "gentle, fun and light" experience, allowing actors to "shake off the dust" caused by the pandemic hiatus, and to "come together to reinvent the tradition" of the fall drama without "losing the essence of the positive culture of Stage East," she said. The audience applause affirmed their success with these goals.

The opening scenes in "That's Not How I Remember It" sparked the audience's enthusiasm, as its hilarious homage to 1980s high school culture and its lighthearted nod to marital memories kept the audience laughing. In excellent performances, senior Farah Suede and junior Brandon Macaluso anchored this one-act play as the parents of a young child, played by junior Evanthea Parsons, eager to stay up late to hear their stories. Playing younger versions of these same parents, sophomores Faith Moran and David LaMonica were lively and funny, setting a tone for the remaining cast, who consistently gave winning performances as over-the-top characters vivifying 80s fashion.

Next, in "The Rules of Comedy," seniors MJ Kirsche and Eleanor Mund played the narrators with great charisma, leading the audience through ways to bring laughs into the world of Hamlet. Once again, the performers delivered in a show that called for careful attention to the timing of lines, blocking and physical movement. Senior Lucas Audette and freshman Matthew Sarkar played off each other effectively in parallel roles, and junior Nicole Barnes proved her theatrical mettle in several cream-pie-in-the-face scenes. This production fulfilled Ms. Quackenbush's goal of "getting as many people onstage as possible, teaching and learning together," and both shows "came together beautifully" as the cast "rose above and beyond" onstage.

East Catholic has always cherished its legacy, and on November 14th, over 200 guests gathered to celebrate those who exemplify the spirit and values of the school. After pandemic delays, the Hall of Fame Committee reconvened in 2021 to select the newest inductees and honorees, and hosted an honorary lunch catered by Highland Park Market. As Associate Director of Advancement Heidi Carlson explained, inductees are chosen in four categories, with each person listed on a Hall of Fame plaque displayed in the first floor main stairway. Honorees are listed as members of an entire team on a "perpetual plaque" displayed in the gym lobby.

East Catholic's former Athletic Director, teacher and Hall of Famer Tom Malin '65 served as emcee after a formal welcome by President Sean Brennan '85 and an opening prayer from Sister Peggy Evans, SNDdeN, also a Hall of Fame member. In an afternoon of heartfelt tributes and speeches, the following were inducted: THOMAS TIERNEY '67 and ROBERTO ZACCARDELLI '83 (Alumni), KYLE BILODEAU '03 and ALLYSON FOURNIER '11 (Athletes), OSMAN DUNIC and LESA MILAS (Faculty & Staff), and LUKE REILLY and THE SULICK FAMILY (Friends). Also recognized were this year's honorees, the members of the 2001-2002 GIRLS BASKETBALL STATE CHAMPIONSHIP TEAM.

As is tradition, each inductee and the honored team were formally presented by members of the Hall of Fame Committee. First, Hall of Famer Ed Fitzgerald '7I gave his tribute to Thomas Tierney, noting how much Mr. Tierney has given to East Catholic and to the Manchester community. The retired former owner of the ohn F. Tierney Funeral Home, founder and first treasurer of the Manchester Area Conference of Churches and incorporator of the Savings Bank of Manchester conveyed his warm memories of the school and gratitude for inclusion in the Hall of Fame. Next, Hall of Famer and retired teacher Ann Marie Ward touted the achievements of Roberto Zaccardelli, Harvard Law graduate, commercial real estate manager, restauranteur and proud father of Giuliana 'II and Alessandra 'I3. In his speech, he noted, "We all learned how to be good friends, good students, good people" at East, with "administrators and teachers who forged us into adults" able



As a community that prizes tradition, East Catholic exuded a spirit of gratitude on the night of Thursday, June 3, 2021, as graduation ceremonies were held once again in the Cathedral of St. Joseph in Hartford. For the members of the class of 2021, the pandemic served as a catalyst for resilience, and commencement affirmed how far the graduates' resilience has brought them. With adjustments made for Covid-19 protocols, seniors sat in reserved rows surrounded by family members, and this year's commencement speaker underscored the importance of family as well. With Brian Bolduc '06 addressing his niece Maddie and her peers in the class of 2021, the power of coming home to celebrate together resonated the entire evening.

To open the ceremony, East Catholic Chaplain Rev. Jaime Maldonado-Aviles offered a blessing, and Interim Superintendent Valerie Mara followed, praising the graduating class in her welcoming remarks. Next, senior class vice president Mallory Moriarty addressed her peers in a thoughtful speech, and class treasurer John Paul Oei read from the Gospel of St. John. Mr. Brennan followed with his own reflective address before participating in the distribution of diplomas with Dean of Student Life Mrs. Jan Reilly, Dean of Academics Ms. Susan Perillo, senior class advisor Sister Peggy Evans, SND and Mrs. Mara.

All-School vice president Maddie Bolduc delighted in introducing her uncle Brian, who extended his stellar speechwriting career in his address. Tracing his path from East Catholic student journalist to director of speechwriting for Vice-President Mike Pence, he emphasized the call to "be different," to immerse oneself in passions and in faith. He invited graduates to see their lives as "an open canvas," with "no color scheme to follow" except that which they create for themselves, until "what you see staring back at you is a masterpiece." After ECCE gave a beautiful performance, senior class president Lucia Spielman shared her final reflections. As seniors celebrated for one last time together in the evening's closing moments, the class lived up to Mr. Bolduc's call to "be grateful for one another," a sentiment clearly felt by the entire East Catholic family that night.

The often-quoted Yogi Berra once said, "Love is the most important thing in the world, but baseball is pretty good, too." The 2021 East Catholic baseball team was, indeed, "pretty good"!

The Eagles won the Class M state championship while securing a 25-0 season record, making them the first undefeated baseball team in school history. The team was anchored by the battery of pitcher Frankie Mozzicato '21 (9-0) and catcher Hank Penders '21, both of whom were all-state selections. Mozzicato, Penders and second baseman Ryan Shaw '21 were chosen as CHSCA Senior All-Stars, while shortstop Alex Irizarry '22 was selected a CHSCA Junior All-Star.

Frankie Mozzicato, a first round/seventh overall draft choice of the Kansas City Royals, was deemed CHSCA Player-of-the-Year, and the team was crowned CHSCA Teamof-the-Year. The Eagles were ranked #1 in the GameTime CT and the HARTFORD COURANT Polls and #25 nationally by USA TODAY.

Besides the team's effective pitchingonly 14 earned runs were relinquished by the top three pitchers (Mozzicato, Ethan Utermarck '21, and TJ Winn '23) - the offense was extremely strong. Seven team members batted over .400, and the team had a .396 batting average.

Nine members of the team will be playing collegiate baseball throughout New England in the spring of 2022.

Tenth year coach, Martin Fiori '90, added to the team's accolades by being chosen as an ABCA (American Baseball Coaches Association) Sports High School Division III Regional Coach-of-the-Year. Coach Fiori calls the championship season "a Team Effort with many moving parts." The players, coaches, and parents were a very tight group, with alumni adding much support to the team's effort. One alum, Mark McMahon '76, a member of East's first state baseball championship team in 1975, left his retirement life in Florida to resume his position as longtime assistant coach.

Frankie Mozzicato spent the summer and early fall in Arizona where he will start spring training in February 2022. He says the transition to this next level of baseball was hard, but it was made easier by his teachers and coaches at East Catholic who made sure he was pushed to the limit of his abilities. Now, he just naturally pushes himself. He is very happy with the Royals organization and the many friends he has already made in his new baseball world.

Looking back on his senior season, Frankie says, "Working hard, always having a goal, and my teammates made it so much fun. Those guys will be my family forever!"

Coach Fiori echoes those sentiments, "There's nothing like celebrating with those you love. I'll cherish the memories of our 2021 group and look forward to being a part of their lives for the rest of time."

Everyone loves how the 2021 Baseball Eagles owned the diamond last spring and took our school and their many fans on a thrilling ride. Yes, Yogi, "love" and "baseball" can certainly appear in the same sentence!
