World language placement exams are required for students seeking to begin year 2 of a language at ECHS. If a student successfully passes the exam and out of year 1, they receive one high school credit for their language studies prior to ECHS. We strongly encourage students to seek this challenge. Students who have successfully completed one year of language content and who want to pass into the second year of the language at East must take a placement test in the spring of their 8th grade year. East Catholic students must study the same language for a minimum of three years to fulfill graduation requirements. Many students continue their study after fulfilling this requirement!
